"Consubstantial with the Father"

Part II

The Nicene Creed originally was composed in Greek; the Greek word used in the phrase is *homoousios*. This is a compound formed from two words: *homo* (same) and *ousia* (essence, being). The use of this word in the Creed was revolutionary in its day because it is not a scriptural but a philosophical term. The greatest heresy of that day, Arianism, argued the Christ was not of the same substance of the Father, but only of a *similar* substance (*homoiousios*) and, therefore, was not equal to the Father. The Church Fathers wanted to be precise in the language used for such a great mystery, and the debates at the time were long and often acrimonious. From the very beginning, the Latin Creed translated this Greek word as *consubstantialem*, for similar precise philosophical and theological reasons. By breaking down the word con-sub-stantial, we can understand it better. *Part III next week.*

Veggie Burger

The time between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day gives most people numerous opportunities to eat hardy, but what about healthy? We've heard repeatedly about the negative effects of too much sodium in processed foods, or the sugar and fats in all those holiday sweets and the dangers of saturated fats in red meat. So what about that veggie burger – should one eat more of this "meat?"

Here are a few points to consider when making your food choices:

1 – "veggie meat" is still processed and can still be high in sodium (salt).

2 – The RDA (recommended daily allowance) for PROTEIN in grams is roughly 1/3 of your body weight. As an older adult you may need more protein to keep good muscle strength. Some veggie burgers have less than 10 grams per serving – be sure to check!

3 – Be aware that meat is also a rich source of zinc, iron and the B vitamins. So if you go vegetarian, especially if you are over 50, discuss supplements or fortified foods with your doctor.

4 – Also missing from the veggie burger (glad to see it go) is the saturated fat. Compared to a lean beef burger it's about 5-6 to 1. That is the biggest nutritional advantage.

It's not necessarily a simple choice, so look at labels before automatically thinking "veggie meat" is best!
