The school year has ended and families will be spending more time together. Summer can be an ideal time for parents to identify any concerns regarding their child's physical and emotional health to help them prepare for another productive year in the classroom. Good mental health allows children to think clearly, develop socially, and learn new skills. It enables them to develop self-confidence and high self-esteem. Basics for a child's good mental health include unconditional love from family, the opportunity to play with other children, supportive caretakers, safe, and secure surroundings, and appropriate guidance and discipline (Mental Health America). Nurture children's self confidence and self-esteem with praise and encouragement. Help them set realistic goals. Make time for play. Playtime helps children be creative and learn problem solving skills. Provide a safe and secure home. Be loving, patient, and be reassuring. If you notice your child having problems with emotions or behavior such as regular worry or anxiety, hyperactivity or fidgeting, persistent nightmares, frequent temper tantrums, depression, sadness, or irritability, consult your pediatrician or a mental health professional.

**Don't come to church empty-handed.** Thank you for your gifts on non-perishable food and household supplies you bring to our Food Barrels. Hunger never takes a vacation!

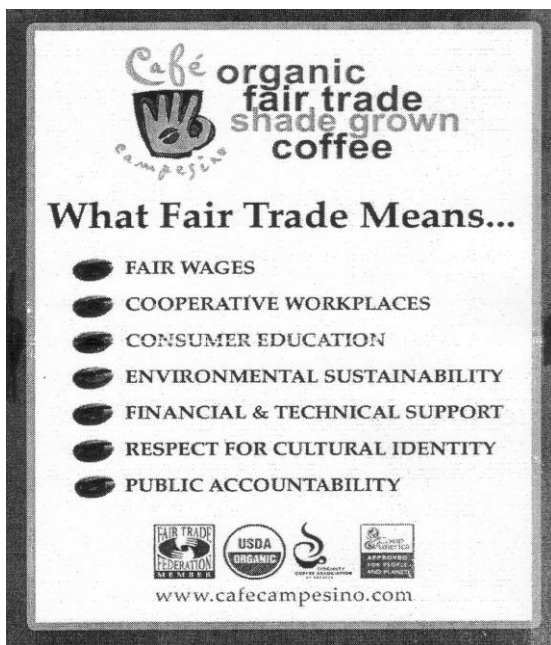
