**SUN ADVISORY:**

**Do's and Don'ts with Chemical Photosensitivity**

Medications including non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDS such as Advil), diuretics, some antibiotics, antidepressants, and high blood pressure drugs can sometimes cause extra-sensitivity to the sun resulting in sunburn, rashes, hives, itching and blistering.



To protect yourself:

- Avoid sun exposure between 10:00 am to 4:00 pm.
- When exposed to the sun use a sunscreen with an SPF of 30, reapplying frequently throughout the day.
- Wear a large brimmed hat to shield your face and cover exposed skin with long-sleeved clothing and pants.
- Read the drug information sheet that accompanies your medicine.
- Do not use tanning beds or sun lamps.

### COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

May 16, 2011

The May 2011 meeting of Parish Council was called to order at 8:00 pm by Cyndi Platt.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Tom Ferdelman and Chris Rauch provided council with the current Building and Maintenance Capital Improvement Plan, which is a comprehensive and prioritized list of projects and associated costs. There are about fifteen projects included in the plan, four of which are in the 2011-12 budget, ranging from plumbing and masonry repair, to landscaping improvements. Finance will recommend the projects to be pursued to council.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Playground: Installation is underway. Volunteer effort is being initiated for the installation of flooring tiles during June. The estimated opening of the playground will coincide with the beginning of the 2011-12 school year.

50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary: Planning is ongoing for a celebration spanning about 15 months. Events include retreats, concerts, and guest speakers. A gala is being planned to culminate the anniversary. A motion was put forth by David Nadler, and seconded by Maggie Collins, for council to approve \$20,000.00 in "seed money" for the anniversary project. Funds would come from the Rentz account. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **PASTOR'S REPORT/STAFF REPORT:**

David Bogle has been hired as our new school principal. He is an alumnus of St. Charles School. A farewell event honoring Fran Moore, Judy Ellerbrock and Mary Burrows is being planned for early June.

### COMMISSION REPORTS

**Faith Formation:** The Autumn Parish Mission is being planned for October 23-26 with Fr. Richard Fragomini.

**Finance Commission:** The commission has been actively auditing parish ministries who manage their own finances. Overall feedback has been favorable and indicates that parish processes are being followed.

**School Commission:** The faculty is preparing for the principal transition. The Charger Support Committee is considering a \$100/family assessment to be used to fund PTO. Concerns have been raised regarding the new playground and parking pattern, and its impact when children leave school.

**Outreach:** The Heifer International fundraiser brought in over \$15,000.00. The Elizabeth New Life fundraiser generated over \$500,000.00 over two evenings. Three parishioners visited our twinning parish, St. Augustine. Outreach will again participate in a program to provide lunches to children during the week of June 27.

**Welcoming/Social Commission:** The next Welcoming breakfast will occur in mid- or late June.

**Worship Commission:** The new instructions of the Roman Missal take effect on the first Sunday of Advent. The Worship Commission is preparing educational materials as well as small group training on these liturgical changes.

**Youth Commission:** The new Athletic Commission Board is in place: Ed Gerding, President; Bart Nye, Vice President; John Sweeterman, Treasurer; Carolyn Ashurst, Secretary. A new Youth Ministry model will attempt to attract more middle school children.

**Young Adult Commission:** Adult volleyball is going well. The next BW3 event is July 17. Planning is underway for a fall retreat. Dr. Scott Janj from Franciscan University has been invited as a guest speaker in November.

The meeting adjourned at 9:17 pm.

**Personally Directed Retreats** – The Jesuit Spiritual Center is offering Personally Directed Retreats June 17-24, July 8-15 and July 29-August 5. These individualized and silent retreats offer participants a quiet time spent in the tradition of the *Spiritual Exercises* of St. Ignatius. Each day includes Mass and a 45-minute meeting with a carefully selected spiritual director.
