Parish to Celebrate Wedding Anniversaries:

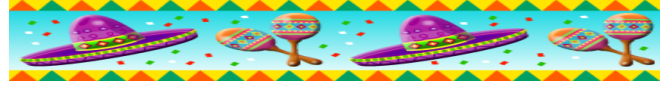
