DIET IMPACT TRIGLYCERIDES

Triglyceride levels increase your risk of coronary artery disease and heart attack. In the past 30 years, triglyceride levels have doubled. For adults over 60, levels have tripled. The optimal level for triglycerides should be less than 150.

To reduce levels one should:

- Decrease intake of simple and processed carbs like those found in soft drinks, fruit drinks, baked goods and non-whole wheat foods.
- Eat fruit which contains fiber and slows the rate at which the fructose is broken down, rather than drinking fruit juice.
- Limit alcohol intake to one drink a day for women and two drinks per day for men. Levels can rise with excess alcohol consumption.
- Get moderate-intensity aerobic exercise for 30 minutes per day at least five days per week.

Tips to reduce sugar without sacrificing taste:

- Read food labels
- Reduce sugar in recipes. In some recipes sugar can be reduced by 1/3 to 1/2 without effecting taste.
- Use sugar alternatives.
- Use sugar-free or low sugar foods.
- Sweeten with fruit.
