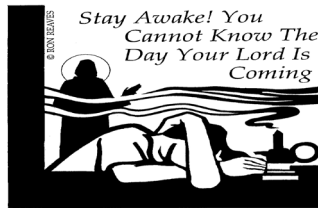

**THE GIVING TREE –** Look for the Christmas Giving Tree in the church Atrium. St. Charles Parish members have annually supported this project to benefit local groups

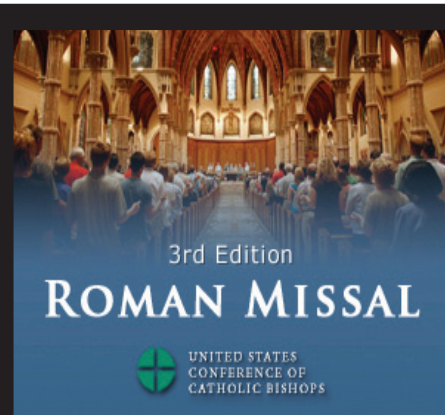

## “Consubstantial with the Father”

Part I

One of the more interesting changes in the revised translation of *The Roman Missal* occurs in the Creed, where a word that few would use conversationally occurs. In the second paragraph of the Creed, the phrase “consubstantial with the Father” will replace “one in being with the Father.” Some may wonder why such an unfamiliar word needs to be used. On the other hand, it may just as easily be asked, whether we understand the phrase, “one in being with the Father”? Both options attempt to put into words one of the great mysteries of our faith, that Jesus Christ is equal to the Father. The use of the term “consubstantial” has been carefully considered before being chosen. Admittedly, the term carries some complexities with it. But the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments recommended its use with good reason. Let’s look at the word more closely (*in Part II – next week*).

### Can Eating Out and Eating Healthy be Synonymous?

They can if you follow a few simple guidelines. Restaurant food tends to be high in **salt**, low in **fiber**, high in **fat** and **big on portions**; all things to avoid, especially as you age.

To eat better when dining out, be informed. Plan what you're having based on healthier options. Many fast food places are now posting nutritional values of their foods. Here are some things to consider:

- \* Since portions tend to be too large, ask for a box right up front or split the meal with someone.
- \* Be sure the protein portion chosen is no bigger than “a deck of cards.”
- \* Forget the fried foods – ask for grilled, steamed, broiled or poached.
- \* Rather than potatoes or rice, get extra vegetables on the side.
- \* Ask for substitutes – use mustard rather than mayo, red sauce rather than alfredo, salsa rather than sour cream, etc.
