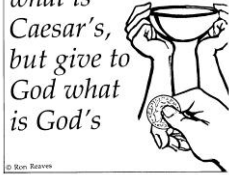

National Mammography Day is October 21, 2011

To help celebrate Breast Cancer Awareness month in October, National Mammography day is designated as the third Friday in the month of October. On this day, or throughout the month of October, participating radiologists provide discounted or free screening mammograms.

Mammography is a specific type of low dose x-ray imaging used to examine breasts. It is used for early detection as it can show changes in breast tissue up to two years before a woman or her physician may be able to feel changes. Current guidelines recommend routine screening, every 1-2 years, beginning at age 40.

Some risk factors for breast cancer include: personal history of breast cancer, a positive family history for breast cancer, genetic alterations, increased breast density, women who had their first menstrual period before age 12 or who went through menopause after age 55, women who had their first full-term pregnancy after age 30 or who have never had a full-term pregnancy, long term use of menopausal therapy, alcohol, inactivity, women who are overweight or obese, and women who took DES during pregnancy.

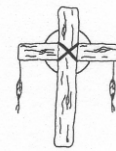

LIBRARY NEWS: Books for Borrowing

The Voice of the Church—A Forum on Liturgical Translation
 This book addresses the nature of liturgical prayer from the experience of those who make up the worshipping assembly by examining prayer in its liturgical texts, the contexts of liturgical prayer, inculturation, and liturgical translation.

Liturgiam Authenticam – Fifth Instruction on Vernacular Translation of the Roman Liturgy.

Laid out in a side-by-side, Latin-English format, this edition of the Instruction is written for liturgists, musicians, catechists, scholars, and parish and diocesan pastoral leaders who work with prayer and worship.

SCHOOL NEWS: As part of our social studies lesson on communities and the common good, third graders will make Halloween cards for St. Charles parishioners who are in nursing homes.

The 4th grade has been studying the digestive system in health. Last week the class created their digestive systems using yarn to see how long they really are. Interested? Your mouth length is the distance from the front of your mouth to your ear. Your esophagus is the length from your mouth to the bottom of your sternum. Your stomach is the length of from your pinky, across your palm to the tip of your thumb...while your hand is spread wide. Your small intestine is your height four times, and your large intestine is your height once. The students had a great time with this, and were marveled at how long their small intestine really is!

Embracing Change

in the

Liturgy – Part VI

What can I do to make the process of change a good one for my parish?

- + Study the new texts with an open heart and an open mind so that you will be ready to use them in the Liturgy.
- + Take advantage of opportunities to learn more about the new texts by attending catechetical programs and reading articles about the new texts.
- + Offer to assist your pastor or parish director of religious education in preparing parish catechetical events.
- + If you are a parent, teach your children the new prayers and help them to understand the changes. Encourage them to participate in the Mass fully and to learn more about their faith.
- + Be very intentional about celebrating the Liturgy each Sunday and holy day. Arrive on time (or a bit early). Pray and sing with attentiveness. Stay focused on the action of the Liturgy rather than letting your mind wander. Hold the Sacrament of the Eucharist in great reverence. Finally, give thanks to God in your heart for so great a gift.

Times of change are always a challenge. But from this challenge can come a deeper appreciation of who we are as the Body of Christ, gathering to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of the Lord.
