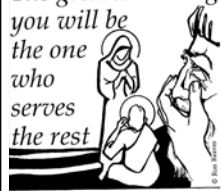

### Who Should Get the Flu Vaccine?

It's that time of year for a reminder about who should give priority to immunizing against the flu. Usually the season starts in late October and runs through March-April, but it takes about two weeks after the shot is received to acquire the maximum immunity. Those who fall under the criteria as "high risk" as listed below should definitely take the CDC's (Center for Disease Control) recommendations for immunization seriously.

- 50 years and older plus 6-23 months of age
- chronic health conditions
- caregivers of children younger than 6 months
- health care workers and those who have contact with "high-risk" individuals
- long-term care residents
- pregnant women, depending on the age of the fetus
- people living in group settings

\*\*FluMist (nasal preparation) has recently been approved by the FDA for children 24-59 months without history of wheezing. It originally was approved only for those between the ages of 5-49 and not pregnant.

Common sense, including good, balanced eating habits; proper rest and frequent and thorough handwashing are still part of the line of defense for staying healthy this winter.

**“And with Your Spirit”**

**Part II**

This ancient Christian use of “spirit,” in both Greek and Latin, was strange to the ancient world. “Nothing like it is known outside Christian writing” (Paulinus Milner, “Et Cum Spiritu Tuo” in *Studies in Pastoral Liturgy*, vol. 3. ed. by Placid Murray, osb, Dublin: The Furrow Trust, 1967.p.202). “With your spirit” was long thought to be a Semitic idiom meaning nothing more than “with you.” The Hebrew word *nephesh* means “soul” or “spirit,” but it can also mean “self.” But the Hebrew word behind “with your spirit” is not *nephesh* but rather another Hebrew term, *ruah*, which means “breath” or “spirit.” The Greek word for spirit, *pneuma*, is never used in the Old Testament to render *nephesh*, but only when translating *ruah*. Thus, it seems clear that the use of “spirit” in the liturgy is not intended merely as a euphemism for “you” but bears some other special theological significance.

**Parish Council Minutes –  
September 22, 2011**

**NEW BUSINESS:** Knights of Columbus Battery Sale. AA and 9V batteries are being sold by the K of C, with the profit from sales being used to provide financial support to seminary students and to sponsor the K of C Vocation Essay Contest for grade school students. Batteries are available for sale in the Hospitality Room.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Parish Council Constitution Amendments. Council reviewed the preliminary draft of the proposed amendments to the Constitution of the St. Charles Borromeo Parish Pastoral Council. Discussion was held about various proposed changes. Cyndi Platt and Peggy Grove will review the suggestions and present a revised draft at the next Council meeting.

Parish 50th Anniversary Celebration: Maggie Collins reported that this will open with the Parish Mission in October. Local artist Paul Melia is doing a special Church portrait, copies of which should be available for purchase next summer. A Jubilee ornament will be available for purchase during the Christmas season. A Jubilee Calendar of Events is being mailed to all parish households. Concerts, lectures and retreats will be offered throughout the year. The Jubilee will conclude with a gala next year, highlighted by a Mass celebrated by the Archbishop.

**PASTOR'S REMARKS:** Brian Phelps, our new seminary intern, began serving the first week of September. Joe Jones will be speaking at all Masses regarding the Stewardship Campaign. All parish households will be receiving a mailing which will emphasize the need to increase collection contributions in order to fund necessary capital improvements.

**OTHER BUSINESS:** Chris Rauch discussed the need to increase security surveillance on the new playground. He presented concerns about the need for better information concerning injuries and vandalism. This can be accomplished for a cost of \$6,700, \$4,000 to come from the playground fund and the balance from other appropriate funds. Concerns about the increased video surveillance were discussed, and it was agreed that Chris will discuss these with the appropriate Archdiocesan office(s) before proceeding with installation of the cameras. Council approved the request to spend funds to improve security surveillance.

**COMMISSION REPORTS:** Adult Faith Formation – Bill Chifala reported that a 5-week Scripture Study program with a focus on the New Missal and its Biblical roots will begin in October. A Bible Study program on the Feasts of Judaism is also being offered this fall. An Advent Wreath making event will be held November 26. There will be several Women's Retreats offered throughout the upcoming year. In conjunction with our Jubilee Celebration, a Lenten series "Walking in the Footsteps of St. Charles Borromeo" will be presented.

Finance: Chris Rauch indicated that July and August collections were favorable but Finance will have a better feel for the quarter at the end of September.

School Commission: John Gochenauer reported that the school has had an excellent beginning of the year. The Commission has assigned responsibilities and discussed school fund raisers. The constricted back parking lot has had a negative impact on student drop-off/pick-up which Commission will be addressing. A dedication for the school's new flag will be held in November.

Outreach: Fr. Haemmerle said Outreach is proceeding with the Twinning project and Fr. Dave Korth from the St. Augustine Mission will be visiting St. Charles in November.

Welcoming: Maggie Collins reported that new parishioners will be invited to attend the live Nativity and they will also be personally contacted with information and an invitation to the Parish Mission.
