The Five Love Languages

One of the most important characteristics of any healthy relationship, is the ability and willingness to express love. An obstacle that many couples face is that each partner might express and receive love in different ways. This lack of understanding can sometimes lead to conflict. Author Gary Chapman has identified five love languages that can lead couples to a better understanding of how they express and receive love.
