MEETING NOTES:

- 1. Opening Prayer, Prayer to St. Charles Chris Bigelow
- 2. Budget Update Samantha Mehrwerth
 - Income
 - Notes from last month
 - There was nothing in the line item for Box Tops.
 - This is likely due to a timing issue.
 - A check for \$490.60 came in right after the last meeting.
 - It was suggested that a reminder encouraging families to participate be placed in the Chatter.
 - This info can also be put in notes to parents.
 - There is even a "how to" video on YouTube.
 - There was also nothing in the line item for Entertainment Books.
 - Mr. Bogle shared that this is because not many of the books were sold.
 - The Knights generally fund two eighth grade scholarships, and give PTO the rest.
 - This year, the money only went to the scholarships, and there was nothing left.
 - Essentially, this means PTO is out around \$900.
 - Dances
 - So far, dances have made around \$2600.
 - Around \$4000 is budgeted for dance income.
 - Expense
 - Teacher appreciation
 - This item was over budget by about \$165.
 - Currently PTO is down about \$2600/2700 due to lower income from Box Tops and Entertainment Books, and higher expense for teacher appreciation.
 - \circ $\;$ It was asked if the parish participates in Amazon Smiles.
 - Yes, though it can be advertised again.
 - This money goes into a different fund, and is not a PTO line item.
 - A member wanted to know if Game Night cost and profit offset each other.
 - Yes, proceeds from the event are used to purchase games for teachers.
 - It was suggested that the PTO look at scheduling some restaurant nights to help offset the deficit.

- Not much work has to be done for these.
- Contacts need to be made and dates need to be set.
- An attendee mentioned that there is a big Box Tops collection scheduled for February 7th.
- 3. Old Business Chris Bigelow
 - Game Night
 - Fifty-seven people from 18 families attended this year.
 - Thirty-seven games were told.
 - A total of 34 games were purchased for various classrooms.
 - This could potentially be a for profit event in the future.
 - Timing might need to be changed as it took place during Catholic Schools Week, which was pretty busy.
 - It was suggested that the night could be opened up to the parish as well.
 - Game Night can be held at any time of year.
 - Purchased games should be in within 2 weeks.
 - Another suggestion was to send home game order forms even if families aren't able to attend.
 - Catholic Schools Week
 - The week went well.
 - The staff luncheon was much appreciated.
 - Chris read a thank you note from Mrs. Krumholtz.
 - Items from the luncheon are in the teachers' lounge for pick up.
 - Students loved seeing Toy Story at Alter.
 - The Science Fair went well.
 - Forty-six judges were present.
 - Certificates were handed out, including 22 for "superior" projects.
 - Eight or nine have confirmed they are moving on to the next round.
 - Best in Show went to Addie Orick.
 - Best in Science went to Amelia Hess.
 - Used Book Fair
 - This raised \$407.02 to buy new books for the library.
 - Fifteen teachers redeemed their \$5 gift cards to buy books.
 - Izzy Brose took two boxes of books to be donated to an African Library.
 - Seven boxes of books went to Food for the Journey project.
- 4. Fish 'n Chips Updates
 - Green envelopes have been sent home, and were due back February 1st, but the deadline has been extended.
 - To date, only \$1121 has been turned in, and this is significantly less than in years past.
 - A rep asked what the reason for the deadline is.
 - The deadline is really so that families turn money in sooner rather than later.

- The silent auction committee does not need to start buying items on February 1st.
- An attendee inquired about an online link so that giving can be done electronically.
 - This is available on the parish website.
 - Fish 'n Chips needs to be selected to indicate that donation should go to the event.
- The volunteer sign up sheet for Fish 'n Chips should go out in late February.
 - Reps were encouraged to sign up for a slot to help in some capacity.
- There will be early bidding on the Art Projects this year.
 - Families can bid on the art during family dining.
 - Members of the silent auction committee will be in the PAC to ensure that only art projects are bid on.
- Drive through will end before family dining begins to hopefully avoid any food backups this year.
- There will be a 50/50 Split the Pot opportunity this year.
 - It will all be done online, and will start a few weeks before Fish 'n Chips.
 - The amount will be announced throughout the night, and the site will be advertised at the event.
 - No volunteers will be needed to run this.
- 5. New Business
 - There will not be a PTO meeting in March.
 - The Junior High Dance will take place on February 8th.
 - Outside schools will not be invited due to volunteer numbers.
 - All St. Charles students in 6th-8th grade are invited.
 - The permission slip is in the Chatter.
 - The 6th grade PTO rep said she could send a request out for 8th grade volunteers to help.
 - Skate World is scheduled for February 24th from 6-8.
 - Flyers will be going home soon.
 - Admission and soft play will be free, but there is a cost for skate rental and any concessions.
 - Follet Book Fair will take place the week of February 24th.
 - Literacy Night will be Tuesday, February 25th, from 6-7:30.
 - The theme is Mardi Gras.
 - Seussical takes place the weekend of March 5-7.
 - Iowa Testing will begin March 9th.
 - A rep asked about the dates for Dewey's Pizza lunches.
 - The lunches will take place April 1st and 2nd.
 - Students pay \$20 to have lunch with their teacher.
 - Pizza from Dewey's is included, as well as a drink, apple slices and pretzels.
 - Dewey's will be giving a \$10 coupon this year instead of a free 11" pizza.

- Mr. Bogle will work on identifying a day for the "be a teacher" items for the silent auction.
- The 8th grade rep asked if 8th graders were going to be going to King's Island this year.
 - She stated that if yes, some parents have already volunteered to help plan.
 - This is supposed to be a math and science day at the park.
 - King's Island has projects for students to do.
 - Chris would like to see this be educational as well as fun.
 - The decision will be up to Chris and Jody, but money is in the budget for this.
- It was also asked if 8th grade will go to El Meson with Mrs. O'Gorman.
 - This will take place.
- Mr. Bogle said he will get dates and clarify for 8th grade reps what is covered.
- They have \$2500 that can go for a graduation party, memory books, etc.
- A rep wanted to know if the Book Fair is Scholastic or Follet.
 - It is Follet.
 - Scholastic takes a higher percentage of sales than Follet.
- The PTO EC will need a new Secretary as well as a 2nd Vice President for the 2020-21 school year.
 - Susie Litke will be happy to answer any questions about what the roles entail.
 - Interested parties can contact an EC member, grade reps, or Mr. Bogle.
